Give your Betta fish plenty of space. In the wild, they live in shallow streams with lots of room to swim. A 5 gallon tank is a good size. Do not keep your Betta in a small bowl. Betta fish are labyrinth fish which means they have a special bladder that allows them to breathe from the water surface. Allow some space at the top of your tank for air. Also use a gentle water filter. Bottom feeders make good tank mates as they stay out of the Betta's way. Do not house 2 males together. Use plants and other items so your Betta has places to hide. In the wild, Bettas hove lots of hiding spots. Provide a light for day that can be turned off at night to mimic day/night.								
Keep your Betta's water at 78-80°. Only use a heater on a tank greater than 1 gallon to avoid the water temp becoming too hot. (daily monitor)								
Feed your Betta with a few Betta specific pellets, not generic flakes. Frozen bloodworms are a treat. (daily)								
Change about 1/4 of your water out (weekly).
